hospital departments be established where contraceptive advice could be given to those who, in the doctor's opinion, should have permanent or temporary relief from child-bearing; and (2) that a more rational and wholesome outlook on sex be encouraged by the teaching of biology and physiology in our schools.

Neither of these recommendations has yet been carried out, and as I said at the beginning, it was this state of affairs that brought the Family Planning Association into being. THERE are three main things that we work for: (1) To give those requiring it, information which would enable them to obtain sound contraceptive advice. The Association is concerned with spacing, not limiting, of children, so that each child will be wanted and welcomed, and the mother will not be harassed by the fear of too frequent pregnancies. Nowadays, another reason why a mother does not want her babies in too quick a succession is the difficulty of getting help

And the proper person to answer this question is, quite definitely, the parent Parents should realise that sex is one of the natural instincts which is given to everyone, just like the desire for food or sleep. They must also recognise that the child is a naturally curious and inquisitive being, who wants to know the reason for everything, and is usually perfectly satisfied with a fruthful answer, but is very quickly dissatisfied with an

evasion. Parents, therefore, will need to have information about their own sexual make-up, in order to answer truthfully and accurately the children's question as they come. There are books which are most helpful on these subjects, the names of which we would be only too glad to pass on.

In adolescent years such preliminary sex education will enable parents to discuss sex difficulties with their children in an open and understanding manner, and the children will never feel they have and the children will never feel they have been let down by their parents in matters which affect them so vitally. - They will also never have the need to seek their information from other, and usually undesirable, sources. It is generally recognised now that ignorance on these matters is at the root of most of the social evils of these times.

I hope this brief outline of the Family Planning Association and its work has in-terested you, and has shown you what a great scope there is for it. Reliable contraceptive information is still far from widely known, many women suffer in greater or less degree for years from minor gynaecological ailments, many of which could so easily be fixed up, and, thirdly, education on sex matters is sadly lacking. So let us resolve right now, to
